GENERAL PROJECT INFORMATION

The Stability and Beyond Program (SAB) just completed its first year of operation. This first year was under FY15 funds and operating from 2/1/17-1/31/18. We are currently operating under our FY16 funds. During the FY15 project year, we assisted 13 individuals in 6 households. Only one household left the program during the operating year, and they exited to a positive housing destination. All other households remained in the project at year end and were successfully engaged in case management. Of the two adults that exited, one was able to increase their income. This first year of operation presented several challenges, especially since this project is our organization's first directfrom-HUD grant and therefore our first time administering a project according to their requirements. In December 2017, over three-quarters of the way through the project year, we received a phone call from the HUD-CPD office in which they told us that they were not aware of our being granted funds and that as a new recipient we had not been provided the support that should have been provided by their office. This communication explained some of our organization's challenges with this first project year. On multiple occasions we had reached out to HUD to request guidance on issues such as supporting documentation required for drawing down funds, in-kind match, documentation of program income, and allowable program activities. On these occasions we received little or no guidance from their office on how we should proceed. In April 2018, we had a monitoring by a representative from the Detroit CPD office, at which time we did receive guidance on some of the questions and issues that we had. We also received some assurance that we were largely performing according to their requirements, with the exception of how much of our allocation we expended. However, please note that we have not received a final Monitoring Report from that visit so we cannot firmly state whether HUD had any findings from our project operation. The Monitoring Report was originally due to our office within 60 days of the completion of the monitoring, though our recent communication with HUD has informed us that it may be several weeks before we get the report, which will be close to 120 days since their visit to our organization. There are several challenges that impacted our ability to expend funds fully. One challenge is the availability of quality rental housing in the service area. We found that it took on average 60-90 days to locate housing that would meet the program requirements and these delays had a significant impact on how much of our funding could be expended, especially since each household could have otherwise had an additional 2-3 months of rent paid under FY15. One other challenge to expending our funds was that we were not given approval by HUD to start our project until late February 2017; however, they informed us that our Start Date would be back-dated to February 1, 2017, which meant that we effectively lost 1/12 of our operating year in which we had no expenses that could be applied to the project. While there

were significant challenges experienced during the FY15 project year, we have found that our current FY16 project is operating much more smoothly.

The West Michigan Housing Network (WMHN), the LPB for this project's service area, has detailed and adopted a prioritization process for households to be referred to projects within the WMHN. Once households complete the Coordinated Entry process with the Housing Assessment and Resource Agency, they are entered onto a Prioritization List for their county of residence with information such as Client Identifier, Household Size, Type of Household, Income & AMI, Special Population Information, VI-SPDAT scores, and other information that is important in assessing initial eligibility for projects. Vulnerability is determined and reflected by the household's VI-SPDAT scores, with higher scores reflecting greater vulnerability. Households are prioritized for referral into this project on the basis of the highest-vulnerability households (who otherwise meet project eligibility requirements) referred first. Should there be an opening in a project that offers more intensive supports than Stability and Beyond (SAB) at the same time that SAB has a project opening, the household with the highest vulnerability will be referred to the more intensive support project and the second-most vulnerable household will be referred to SAB.  - On April 16-18, 2018 our organization and this project were monitored by Ellen Chung of the Detroit HUD-CPD office. Ms. Chung reviewed program records, financial records, client records, and visited program participants in their home. She also conducted an exit interview with a member of our Board of Directors prior to finishing up the monitoring visit. We were informed that we could expect the final Monitoring Report from HUD within 60 days of the monitoring visit; however, even though we are in excess of 90 days since the monitoring, we have not yet received the report. We have reached out to HUD to verify the status of the Monitoring Report, and have been informed that it will be several more weeks until it will be received by our organization. At this time we cannot accurately state whether there have been any findings or not, nor can we provide our response. As soon as the Monitoring Report has been received we will forward it to the MI BOSCOC. We are more than happy to discuss this matter further if additional clarification would be beneficial.

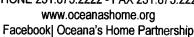

Homeless Service Programs

Prioritization Policy

For all homeless services and programs, clients are to be served according to the following prioritization plan.

Clients will complete and submit the HARA intake application which will be used to screen for eligibility across all HARA administered homeless and homeless prevention services. Those households that have been confirmed to be homeless will then have either the VI-SPDAT or SPDAT administered for single-person households or the VI-F-SPDAT or F-SPDAT administered for multiple-person households to determine their acuity. The only exception to this prioritization is households that require Emergency Shelter and are not able to be successfully diverted from shelter. Households requiring Emergency Shelter are served when shelter is needed and available.

Below is a general outline of acuity scores and the appropriate interventions that should be offered to households within each of the 3 acuity ranges—Housing Help Supports, Rapid Re-Housing, and Housing First:

Within each category, those clients scoring nearer to the top of the threshold are the first priority. For example, if two clients have undergone an intake and one scores a 53 on the SPDAT and the other scores a 49 and there is only one opening on a program caseload, the individual with a 53 is served before the person who scored a 49, regardless of the date of their application.

Upon completion of the intake, the household will be reviewed for eligibility across all HARA administered homeless and homeless prevention programs. In order for households to qualify for service, they must not only meet the eligibility requirements outlined under the specific program of entry but they must also meet the following minimum standards for acuity:

When filling a vacancy in any of the above programs (with the exception of an emergency motel voucher), the household that meets the program requirements and has the highest level of acuity must be served first. If there are two or more households that meet program requirements and are tied for the highest acuity and there are not enough program openings to serve them all, the Program Manager and/or Executive Director should exercise judgement in determining which household appears to have the most barriers and greatest need due to other extenuating factors in their situations.

Regardless of the priority sequence and scoring outlined above, there may be instances when particular circumstances may be taken into account in establishing the priority of the clients to be served. This decision rests with the Program Manager and/or Executive Director. It is incumbent upon these decision makers to justify exceptions in service delivery, acknowledging that there can be many reasons for an exception based upon local circumstances at any point in time. It is important that this approach is used infrequently, in limited circumstances, and with sufficient justification.

Prioritizing Chronic Homelessness

According to the

New Chronic Homeless Definition

Effective January 15, 2016

To be considered **chronically homeless**, the adult Head of Household must:

have a certified disability, AND

 have been living in a place not meant for human habitation, in an emergency shelter, or a safe haven for the last 12 months continuously OR on at least four occasions in the last three years where those occasions cumulatively total at least 12 months

There is not a minimum number of days in which each distinct occasion of homelessness must total but instead, occasions are defined by a break in homelessness of *at least seven days* not residing in an emergency shelter, safe haven, or residing in a place meant for human habitation. Stays in institutions of fewer than 90 days *do not* constitute a break in homelessness and count toward the total time homeless. Transitional Housing does not count toward homelessness.

The Final Rule establishes recordkeeping requirements for documenting chronic homelessness that take into account how providers use Homeless Management Information Systems (HMIS) and that does not require documentation of each day of homelessness but a method that can be more easily implemented.

Certifying Chronic Homelessness:

- **A. Disability Certification**—the adult head of household must be disabled. Certification of disability may come from one of the following sources:
 - a. Written statement from a licensed professional
 - b. Written statement from Social Security Administration
 - c. Receipt from a Social Security Administration payment
 - Written observation from intake worker of disability with confirmation of disability within 45 days
- **B.** Homeless History—the adult head of household must have their homeless history documented to verify chronicity.
 - a. Priority preference given to Third Party Verification, then to Written Observation from case worker, finally to Self-Certification
 - i. Self-certification cannot account for more than 3 months of homeless verification
 - b. If there is one documented instance of homelessness in a month, that whole month is able to be counted toward the total 12 months cumulative required

Prioritization for Permanent Supportive Housing designated for Chronic Homelessness:

The goal of prioritization is to ensure that homeless individuals and families with the most severe service needs receive priority in program admission. Admission to PSH units designated for Chronic Homelessness must be prioritized as follows:

1. First priority is for those who are certified as chronically homeless (as defined above) and who have a SPDAT score of at least 40 for singles or 53 for family units.

- Second priority is for those who are certified as chronically homeless (as defined above) and who have a SPDAT score of less than 40 for singles or less than 53 for family units.
- 3. Third priority is for those who are currently homeless (according to HUD Category 1) and who have a cumulative homeless history of at least 6 months during the last 3 years and who also have a SPDAT score of at least 40 for singles or 53 for family units.
- 4. Fourth priority is for those who are currently homeless (according to HUD Category 1) and who have a cumulative homeless history of at least 3 months during the last 18 months and who also have a SPDAT score of at least 40 for singles or 53 for family units.
- 5. Fifth priority is for those who are currently homeless (according to HUD Category 1) and who have a cumulative homeless history of at least 30 days during the last year and who have a SPDAT score of at least 36 for singles or 45 for family units.

Homeless histories must be documented according to the standards outlined in the Final Rule and a copy of the SPDAT score sheet must be retained in the client file.
