Eric has served as the executive director of the Michigan Coalition Against Homelessness for more than 11 years, helping to grow the organization's reach and impact.

He's been engaged in helping vulnerable populations as both a staff member and volunteer with various local, regional, statewide and national organizations for over 38 years.

Eric has extensive professional experience in the non-profit sector including executive, program management, and outreach/engagement roles at the statewide and national level (including executive experience with statewide and national mental health awareness and advocacy organizations).

His board service has included membership on the Michigan's Homeless Policy Council (MHPC) which oversees Michigan's Campaign to End Homelessness, eleven years as a member of the Michigan Balance of State Continuum of Care (2 years as chair) and seven years as a member of the Mental Health Association in Michigan's board. Eric has been involved locally with numerous organizations, with examples including a DV program board (25 years of service, serving in all officer capacities) and a long-term care and assisted living community (20 years of service, currently the Vice Chair).

Additionally, he has been a member of the St. Johns City Commission for 9 years, serving as Mayor the past four years.

Eric earned his undergraduate degree from Michigan State University and Masters of Public Administration from Western Michigan University.
