The Director of Finance and Operations for CDVSA is familiar with the Uniform Administrative Requirements, Cost Principles, and Audit Requirements for Federal Awards, and there is a copy of 2 CFR Part 200 available for referral by all employees on the business team. The Director of Finance and Operations has worked in the area of non-profits for the last 5 years, and has a bachelor’s degree in accounting. In addition, CDVSA has three CPAs on its Finance Committee, all of whom are actively involved in giving professional advice and providing input and oversight whenever needed.

### **2. Describe your organization’s (and subrecipient(s) if applicable) experience in leveraging Federal, State, local and private sector funds.**

CDVSA accounts for all awarded funds separately and distinctly from other sources of funding. CDVSA uses the accounting software program “QuickBooks” and sets up every grant which needs to be tracked as a “job”. Each grant can then have a separate budget and any expense incurred for the purpose of the grant would be tagged to the job. Individual grant profit and loss reports can be generated to show how much of the funds have been spent, the amount remaining, and compare actual expenses to the grant budget.

In the past, CVDSA has identified and secured matching funds from sources such as In-Kind cash match utilizing volunteer work hours as well as a cash match utilizing general funds not obtained from federal or state grants.

Using a Housing First Model, CDVSA will inform survivors seeking to flee an abusive partner about their TSH units and RRH program. Survivors will be prioritized in the TSH units based on the greatest need, which may include safety and location of employment/school/support system. Survivors in need of RRH, will be prioritized based on coordinated entry process and their own choosing of voluntary supportive services. Supportive Housing Advocates will be employed to reduce the burden to survivors, provide support for reaching their defined goals that may include, but are not limited, to safety, education, economic justice, housing, parenting, and social well-being. Survivors will choose the place, date, and time for all meetings with their advocates.

**2. Describe the specific plan to coordinate and integrate with other mainstream health, social services, and employment programs for which program participants may be eligible.**

- a. Partnering with healthcare: CDVSA is a partner with Mid-Michigan Health and provides trainings in areas of human trafficking, domestic violence assessment, and safety planning. We facilitate Sexual Assault Nurse Exams (SANE), offering crisis response, acute, and non-acute medical exams. We also have a collaborative partnership with Community Mental Health, with the ability to make referrals and seek professional consultation, on an as-needed basis.
- b. Partnering with Housing: CDVSA is a sub-recipient of Home to Stay (Midland County HARA) and Mid-Michigan Community Action Gladwin County HARA, for RRH-CV, as of October, 2020. Additionally, CDVSA has worked with Home to Stay and Sacred Heart Mission to receive household items for survivors. We also collaborate with Rediscovered Treasures providing housing services and referrals.
- c. Occupational and Educational Partnerships: In addition to housing needs, CDVSA has also partnered with MiWorks for 18 months to assist survivors looking for jobs. The YWCA has partnered with CDVSA for three years, and MSU Extension has provided collaboration for five years. Both of these organizations help CDVSA facilitate educational opportunities and life skill development.
